Counter Surfin'

We love our hounds...right?!?!??
The trick is not to love 'em to death!

It's the time of the year when the smells in the kitchen will drive any dog to distraction. Even really good dogs will be overcome with the urge to get up on the counter and check things out a little closer with that nose.

Oh and that nose is able to extend *waaaay* beyond the edge of the counter. Push back anything that may tempt those hounds...in fact, push back everything or better yet, put food totally off the counter, table, floor, perhaps even your pockets.

Our dogs love to “pocket dive” because every once in a while they find crumbs from a cracker or dog treat in there.

My hounds love – well just about any food item that isn't bolted down. At times when I am feeling good about the way something tastes, I am very tempted to give them “just a bite” as a reward. A bite of turkey; a bite of dressing; a bite of potatoes with gravy; a bite of pumpkin pie; a bite of whatever is available.

And before you know it off to the vet we must go where it will take a bite out of my budget...all because I couldn't control my urge to treat my dog.

Human foods, especially during the holidays, tend to have a higher-than-is-good-for-your-dog fat and sugar content. Gastroenteritis and pancreatitis are neither cheap nor painless. And it could lead to death. If you must treat your dog during the holiday, give an extra dog-made cookie or biscuit.

Be wary of the dog and pet treats on the shelves of your local stores.

This time of the year, retailers wrap up baskets filled with cute little things for pets and guilt-trip us into putting something out for our furry friends.

Remember last years scare about pet food poisoning dogs and cats? Well that lesson should be remembered. We always check for country of origin on the treats and food we give to the dogs, not because we are isolationists, but because we want their food, like ours, to come under some inspection and quality standards.

So give your dogs an extra chew or biscuit...tie a ribbon on it if you must... and hugs...lots of hugs.
